My Dear Wife Elizabeth it is with pleasure I take my pen to write to you to inform you that I am well and hope you are enjoying the same blessing well my dear I have not much news to write but last night I was awakened by a man running past our building crying fire fire it was about 12 o'clock at night I jump up out of bed to find my room filled with smoke I of course thought that the Hospital was on fire and I rushed to the wash room in my sleep and caught a pail of water and back to my own room when I became rightly aware and discovered that it was a large steam Bakery across the street and 40 feet from our house I always sleep with my window open and door shut and the wind blowing towards the back it filled my room full of smoke but after the smoke cleared out I sat and watched the devouring Element as it progressed on its way of destruction it was truly exciting to hear the wild shouts of fire cried by over 100 voices and the fire bells ringing and the fire men and steam fire engines as they arrived at the scene of action I sat at my window and enjoyed the thing for they were such and I would not assist in saving anything though many of the soldiers went in on their own hooks as there was a hardware store that had caught they supplied themselves with tin cups knives forks tea and coffee pots revolvers and spics sweet cokes candies and all kinds of confectionery it was grand to see them fire engines throw water and to see them up stairs throwing out looking glasses and earthen ware out of a third story window and smashing them all to pieces to save them and then to hear the crash of falling timbers and the high buck walls as they fell it pleased me and was a grand sight the fire destroyed a large brick Block Hardware and Bakery = to day it has rained hard all day and it is dark and gloomy and such a day as makes me think of home and my dear wife and children and long to be with them you know my dear Elizabeth such days I used to be out in the house with you either bothering you or sleeping and about the middle of the afternoon would start to town to hear the news to day dear wife I slept all forenoon and can bother you no way but by writing and as I am in the city will not have to go out in the rain I will stop writing for the present until I get something more to write

June 29 Dear wife I will pen a few more lines to you as I am still
very lonesome and melancholy it is still raining and was when
when I commenced writing this a few days ago and I quit writing and
thought I would wait until fair weather but as there is no sign of
fine weather I will proceed with my long letter so as to have it ready
to send as soon as I receive one from you well dear wife I have
got one of them awful spells of the blues that you have seen me in
when I am cross and nothing goes right I have been thinking of
you and longing to see you and thinking about the cursed
copperheads in the north and one played thing and another that
I have the horrors pretty bad dear wife we keep hearing of the doings
of the copperheads in various parts of the northern states and ashamed
to say the southern part of Ill leads the van they have murdered poor
sick soldiers that have gone home to recruit their healths in parlous
and in parts of Iowa they hold public meetings and are breaking up
union meetings and are driving our soldiers out of the country that
have gone home in parlous dear dear wife wear it not for you and little
ones I should never want to return to Ill but I thank god Boone county
I hope is all right all this news I have got from soldiers that have been
home is it any wonder then dear that I have the blues the nurses are all
asking me what is the matter and the lady nurse said she would give me a
kiss if I would only let the frown die on my face and not look so cross but
dear wife I can't always control my feelings you know I try to make myself
agreeable and look as pleasant as I can and I took a dose of salts this morn-
ing and mean to try and phthis phisic the blues if it succeeds
I will let you know dear wife if you have got the likeness of yourself
and just that Horning took for me before I left I would like for you
to send it to me if you have a chance I don't like the picture I have I
will send it home and you can send it to your wife or I will send
it if you give me her name and address dear wife we have got ripe
apolo hear but they wear raised last year dear wife you have not
told me whether you went strawburging this year or not = recall every
thing in my mind in its season and dear I often have I thought of the many
happy moments of my life since you dear Elizabeth became my wife and linked
your fortunes with mine I got a letter from Mr Ogilvie yesterday and answered
the same Brother is all right although he had some close calls his cloth was shot through
several times and his haversack spoiled and he was struck by a spent ball on
the shin which would have escaped him gun going into the nest of the
but god bless his brave heart they would not fear him out of the
fight so he was fighting for principle and right he said he expected to
fight and had been marching all winter and chasing the crows to W

Get a chance to fight and now he had got a chance and went to
improve it my dear wife I love him better than a brother for
his Bravery and courage for Benichet when they found him he was
alive with ingots and so determined that none dare lay hands on him
but dug a hole and rooted him in like an animal Flehens would not take
anything out of his pockets so they buried him money and all what a sad thing
this is dear wife what awful news to his poor wife but such is war I would not
say anything about it my dear unless the news is already there for it will make
his folks feel bad well dear the salt I have taken free me to quit writing for
the present I will finish this soon = oh but I would like to kiss you just
now first date June 30 Dear wife your of 22 came to hand I am
happy to hear that you were well and enjoying yourself but I must say dear
that you are a strange wife you will let troubles and cares come over you
to make you feel bad when there is no need of it now I thought those
things I sent you would please you and that they might be precious to
you and as they wear no use to me at present I thought I would send
them to you I have got a rubber blanket that don't weigh half so much
and is far better but you say they made you feel bad and that you
put them out of sight for it made you think I was dead now my
dear this is very foolish I thought you had more courage than that but
dear wife I will not send you any more of my old traps but will
throw them away I hope you will find those tracts interesting and may
be profited by reading them I have written some news concerning Brother
and you probably have heard as I got a letter from Sarah yesterday
and she has received one from Bob she wrote me a frustrated letter
and I laughed while reading it she said she had sent carried you
three letters that week and that you were not at home neither time
and she said she was not to blame for not seeing you I wish you had
been to home but I suppose you were enjoying yourself better and
I am well enough pleased = I am sorry to hear of your mother's poor
poor health am sorry she can't come to see you this summer = I have not
received any letter from her since I inquired now you are afraid that
they want many men that will live to get home then you are fearing
again of course you will see nothing but cripples for a sound soldier
has no need of a discharge at least they have no right to one till the
devil is whipped out of the secess you must remember that we are
all in the hands of God and if he is with us who can be against
us or unless he sees fit the balls of the enemy cannot harm us and if
